## Don't Leave Home Without It - Jim Zientara, W4MAN

Going on a trip? Be sure to pack your toothbrush and clean underwear. If just wandering around town, make sure there is enough gas or stored electricity in the car.

In 2018, I had a local attorney update some estate documents for my wife and me.

Some of the documents are the living will, will, living revocable trust, durable power of attorney, health care surrogate, declaration naming a pre-need guardian, etc. Your attorney might recommend these or other documents for you.

With a ton of documents in my hand, I asked if I could scan and copy them to a flash drive. "Sure, why not?" said the attorney. Not being an attorney nor practicing law, I took the advice.

There is no personally identifiable information, such as Social Security numbers, bank account numbers, etc., on the documents. The documents only pertain to my wife and I and our heirs.

I bought a metal, not plastic, flash drive that had a ring loop on it and 32 GB of storage. We attached them to our key rings. I then scanned and copied these legal documents to our flash drives. Password protection is optional.

I thought it was a good and handy idea. Your GB storage size may vary.

A few weeks after receiving the updated documents and loading them on the flash drives, my wife and I attended the annual convention of the National Model Railroad Association in Kansas City, MO. My wife of 56 years became ill and was briefly in the emergency room at a KC hospital. Medically, everything worked out fine.

The Admissions Administrator at the hospital asked if my wife had a living will and other legal documents available. I said I had what was probably wanted. It is on a flash drive. The Administrator hesitated because of the fear of a virus on the flash drive that could affect the hospital's network. However, Admissions did have a computer that was not on the hospital's network.

I gave the Administrator my wife's flash drive. My flash drive had similar information. The Administrator returned after a few minutes and couldn't stop talking about how wonderful the flash drive arrangement worked. It had all the documents they needed, and they were up to date.

The Administrator said she will tell the hospital, her parents, and everyone else of the great idea of the flash drive filled with appropriate documents.

A legal question for your attorney is validity. Is your will, health care surrogate, etc., valid in other states and outside the country? My attorney couldn't say, but having the paperwork is better than not having it.

I suggest speaking with a qualified professional to get your legal documents in order, because you just don't know where you will be when you need them, regardless of your age.

A grandparent may want to put on a flash drive information for himself, spouse, kids, grandkids, etc. For example, who has authority to help a grandkid visiting you that gets hurt and needs hospitalization?

Frequently, people leave their important documents in a file cabinet, a safe deposit box, with their attorney, etc. They may be secure, but how do you get to them when needed? An early question asked is, show me the paperwork. If you had a flash drive, I assume there is somebody, somewhere, that could print out the documents.

The flash drive is just one of many places to store documents. There are various vaults online in the cloud to consider. Some people may feel that uploading documents to the cloud is risky. Maybe so, but the digital world knows lots about you right now.

Since the hospital incident, we've been adding more info to our flash drives and the online vault, including pictures of the family, cardiologist heart scans, and other items I may need or like having handy on a moment's notice. There really is no limit to what to add.

My cardiologist thought it is a great idea. It gives a picture of the heart in the past and a new heart scan may indicate if things have changed.

I've since added other medical documents, such as my latest blood test, list of prescriptions, vitamin supplements, a list of doctors, my pre-paid funeral director, etc. The info held on the flash drive keeps growing and is being updated frequently.

If you like and as a courtesy to my fellow hams, my office will help in the scanning and transferring of your documents to the flash drive that I'll provide.

So don't leave home without it. That is, your flash drive on your key ring.
