

Ham Shack of the Month – Cecil Fox – KF4CSM

This month's ham shack is proudly owned by Cecil Fox, KF4CSM. Cecil has worked tirelessly for MARCI and for the ARES/RACES organization. He is a firm believer in having his equipment "ready to go mobile" when the situation arises. Although Cecil has a setup in his garage, his new primary station for operating on various nets and participating in various drills is in a corner bedroom.

Cecil provided a short description of his equipment. A more detailed description is available in the Appendix at the end of the newsletter.

"My new shack is in a corner bedroom. I am stacking radio equipment because of lack of space. The photo shows my Yaesu FTM-400 mounted inside a Gator Box. Above it are 2 power supplies mounted in another Gator Box. The FTM-400 is connected to a Diamond Antenna X700HNA mounted on top of 30-foot mast and wired with LMR400DB coax.


"I am building another Gator Box to go on the stack with a Wouxun KG-100G GMRS mount inside. The KG-1000G will be wired with LMR400DB coax connecting to a BRC HP-500 GMRS antenna which will be mounted on top of another 30-foot-tall mast.


"To the left of my Gator Boxes is my Church Security BlackBox Bantam 462 MHz UHF radio connected to a Btech 20-watt amplifier, which connects to a Browning beam antenna pointed North toward my church.

"My Dell XPS 8950 Desktop runs dual 27' Monitors. Above the computer monitors is a 32" Samsung TV.

"I keep my Handy Talkies charged on a small chest behind my radio station.

"I ran my entire shack when the power went off for six days using two Ampere Time Lifepo4 100 Amp Hour batteries and a 1500-watt power inverter. My generators kept the batteries charged during the entire power outage. If both of my generators were to fail. I have multiple solar panels to charge batteries with."







Thanks, Cecil, for sharing your pictures and descriptions with us! You certainly have a station to be proud of!


