Annual MARCI Awards

The criterion for each award is as follows:

Ham of The Year

Typically awarded to a MARCI member who has gone 'above and beyond'. Some examples are, but not limited to, a member who has demonstrated superior service or dedication to MARCI by donating personal time to MARCI for a specific reason or task and performed extraordinarily. A member who did assist in transporting a member or members who cannot or may not have been able to provide their own transportation to meetings, or a member serving on the board of directors, be that an officer, or other official functioning member of MARCI.

Elmer of The Year

Typically awarded to a MARCI member who has frequently provided 'Elmering' (i.e., education, technical assistance, station set-up or computer aid, antenna or radio mentoring, or other practical ham radio related experiences) to members in need, through direct individual contact, print, or group session. Another example would be a member who has given of their time to assist the MARCI Club by providing demonstrations or programs at one or more monthly meetings.

Special Recognition Award(s)

The criteria here should be someone who has been not only a standout member of MARCI for whatever reason but whose efforts demonstrate an effort to the promotion of, service to, and dedication to the Manatee Amateur Radio Club. An example would be someone who has performed on a committee or acted as a regular net control op or even as a substitute control op for one or more nets. You may nominate more than one individual in this category.

Thanks for taking the time to participate in this important effort to recognize your fellow MARCI members. You will soon receive an e-mail ballot if you haven't already. Please e-mail your choice of MARCI members for these awards by replying to this email. Your votes will go to the MARCI club secretary.

What Happens to Your "Stuff," by Jim Zientara, W4MAN

There are two basic problems: 1) where is your stuff and 2) who gets your stuff. Consider giving access to your trusted people, i.e., those who need to know, as part of your financial and estate plan.

As a start, clean up the mess you will leave. You should have an inventory of your ham equipment, its current value, etc. You also need an inventory of the rest of your stuff. You should make a written document or create something else permanent, like a flash drive. To protect your will, deed, title to the home, and other important documents you also need a similar physical storage method, accessible by your trusted contact.

A well-equipped financial and estate go-kit, along with a radio go-kit, should be part of your planning. I believe that a financial and estate plan is incomplete if not adequately shared with the people who may need to know how to put your plan into action following your disability, incapacity, or death.

The estate problem can be complicated and prone to arguments. I feel it is your job to leave a clear picture of where your stuff is and then who gets it. It's not fair to leave the work to others. Once you have an idea of where your stuff is and a written plan, the next problem is, who gets your stuff.

Leaving little stickers here and there have a tendency to disappear. Let's try and do it right the first time.
