BALANCED...Radio is a hobby, never interfering with family, job, school, or community.


PATRIOTIC...His/[Her] station is always ready for service to country and community.

My main rig is a recent Elecraft K3S. I previously had an Elecraft K3 which was more than adequate. I've worked the world with it and did a credible job in a number of contests. The 3S has a number of great features that I wanted so I made the plunge. I have the P3 scope to use with it. I also have an FT-817ND (up for sale). I use a 19-foot tall 4BTV antenna which is great for 40, 20, 15 and 10 meters. I operate CW almost exclusively. My key of choice is Begali which is superior to my older Bencher paddle. I can copy 25 wpm comfortably and do ok with 30 wpm in contests.

I have DXCC on 15 and 20 Meters and I'm close on 10 and 40.
